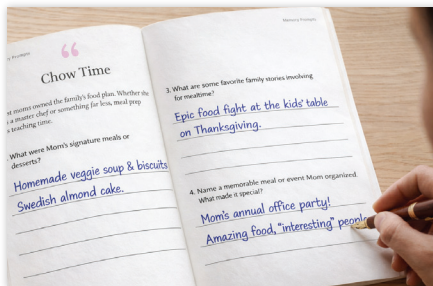
# Author Q&A

The muse for the pen name Bunky Weaver is a beloved pen pal gone too soon. Bunky would have loved seeing her name on a book series on gratitude.

## 1. What inspired you to create this book?

I was looking for a Mother's Day gift and ordered two different "Mom, tell me your story" books, thinking one would be a winner. Neither one worked for me. I was afraid my mom might get annoyed by getting a book full of writing prompts. It seemed less like a gift and more like homework.

Fast forward a few months. Mom sent me some of the cards and letters I'd given her over the years as part of her ongoing "death cleaning" exercise. The package included a sweet, multi-page handmade birthday card I'd made:

"60 Things My Mother Taught Me." It was full of my Mom's simple lessons, like "Say please and thank you" and "Count your many blessings." Plus some quirkier ones like "Buy things on sale whenever possible" and "If it ain't broke, don't fix it." That card gave me the idea to create the book *Mom, Thank You for All You Taught Me*.

## 2. Why did you include journal prompts in the back of the book?

It's a challenge trying to write down Mom lessons that resonate with most people. This book is a gift for mothers, so it has to be just right. The only way for that to happen is for people to add their own memories.

## 3. How did Peter Osman's art become part of the book?

I met Peter several years ago and instantly fell in love with his artwork. My husband and I digitized his drawings and paintings, thinking we might help him sell them online. Unfortunately, that was not in our skill set. But later when I was thinking about illustrations for the Mom book, I immediately thought of Peter's art. I looked through my hard drive of Osman artwork. It was as if each one was tailor-made for a certain phrase. I showed him the concept, and he agreed to let his work be part of this project.

## 4. Do you have any other "Thank you" books coming?

Yes! A Dad version of this book is in the works.

## 5. Why did you choose the pen name Bunky Weaver?

Bunky Weaver was my pen pal, all handwritten letters, for close to a decade. She passed away in 2023 and I miss her terribly. She was an autodidact, the kind of person who knew all the Jeopardy answers. Bunky didn't have a lot of money or possessions, but she was one of the richest people I ever met because she had gratitude. It's an honor to keep her name alive through what I hope to be a series of positive, fun books that celebrate the people we love the most.

## 6. What are you hoping readers will get from this book?

As I was putting this *Mom, Thank You* book together, it hit me how much a loving mother invests in her offspring — for years on end. It's breathtaking! As a person who is always looking for a fresh way to show my mom the love, I wanted to create something that hints at the magnitude of what mothers do for us and teach us.

Finding the right gift can be a challenge. Most of us have given Mom a mug or a plaque or a t-shirt or some flowers. This book is intended to help us give Mom what she deserves most — our gratitude.
